„Protection & Rescue Zurich“ is the largest civilian rescue organization of Switzerland. 400 employees have 3500 tasks every year, that makes ten to twelve tasks per day.



The tasks are from, „get the cat from the tree“ to big fires in which the firefighters daily risk their lives to protect other people.

The soldiers were impressed of the vehicles and the modern technology that are used there. Christian Wolf, our guide, gave us a good view into the life of a „real“ fire-fighter.

we had another chance to go for a walk. Surely, it was not an ordinary way at the boarder of the lake.

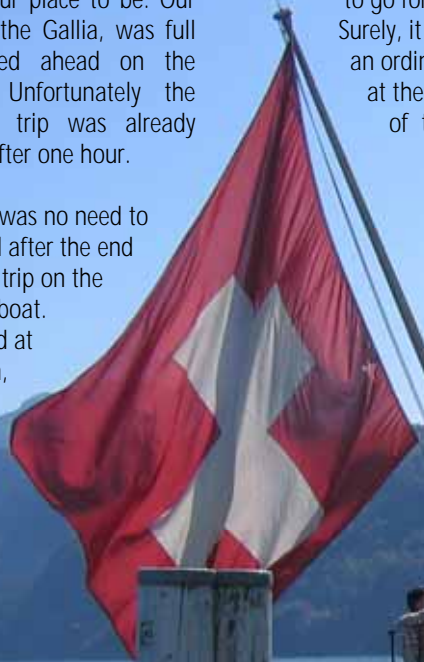


The varied way followed a street under tunnels with the possibility to see the lake and the opposite boarder. Such a great view!
